



AHMED LATHEEF - A BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE



Ambassador Ahmed Latheef began his Foreign Service career in 1981 as an Assistant Undersecretary at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He completed Foreign Service training in India with the Indian Foreign Service (IFS) Officers in 1982 and had further education and training in Berlin, Germany in 1989.

His career in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, since 1983 was largely in the area of bilateral and multilateral cooperation, more particularly dealing with South Asian regional cooperation. Since the formative days of South Asian regional cooperation, he worked in the SAARC Division, and had attended all major SAARC meetings during 1985 to 1997. He was a prominent member of the Organizing Committee of the Fifth SAARC Summit held in Male' in 1990 and played an equally important role during the Ninth SAARC Summit held in Male' in 1997 in his capacity as the Director from Maldives at the SAARC Secretariat. He also attended meetings of the UN, Non-Aligned Movement and the Commonwealth.

Ambassador Latheef served at the SAARC Secretariat in Kathmandu, Nepal from 1993 to 1997 as the Director from the Maldives, and after his return to Maldives he headed the Department of External Resources of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from 1997 to 2003 as the Director-General of External Resources. During this period he was responsible for mobilizing and coordinating all bilateral assistance to the Maldives and multilateral assistance from UN agencies. Ambassador Latheef also worked at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as Director-General, Foreign Relations from 2003-2004.

Ambassador Latheef had held the post of Alternate Governor from Maldives to the Islamic Development Bank (IDB) from 1998 to 2003 during which period he had attended all the Annual General Meetings of the Board of Governors of the Bank.

Ambassador Latheef had played a significant and pioneering role in setting up the first resident mission of Maldives in India when he was posted as the Deputy High Commissioner of Maldives from November 2004 to August 2007. During this period he had contributed significantly to consolidate the close and friendly relations between India and the Maldives.

After completing his three-year term in New Delhi, Ambassador Latheef moved to China 2007 to open the Maldivian Embassy in Beijing and served as the first Ambassador of his

country in Beijing for five years. It was largely due to Ambassador Lateef's foresight and tireless efforts during this period that Chinese tourist arrivals in the Maldives reached the top of the list, outnumbering the traditionally strong European visitors. During his stewardship Ambassador Latheef helped further strengthen the close relations between the two countries. In the field of sports, Ambassador Latheef was popularly acknowledged as the "Ping Pong Ambassador" in China for his dynamic role in promoting ping pong diplomacy, through the annual Diplomats Table Tennis Tournament; a tournament that was well participated by the diplomatic community for four years.

Ambassador Latheef returned to Male' after completing his term of office in February 2012. Since then he has been promoting sports in the Maldives as the President of the Table Tennis Association of Maldives from 2012- 2016 and as the Vice President of the Maldives Olympic Committee, a post to which he was elected in 2017 for a four-year term. He is also the current Regional Vice President of the Asian Table Tennis Union (ATTU).

On 1st October 2018, upon the recommendation of President-elect, Hon. Ibrahim Mohamed Solih, Ambassador Latheef was appointed as the Director-General of Transition, charged with the responsibility of establishing the Office of the President-elect and ensuring the smooth functioning of the transition process prior to the inauguration of the President on 17 November 2018.

Ambassador Latheef continues to be an avid sportsman, who as a young man, was selected for the first ever Maldives Table Tennis team that represented the country in an international tournament in 1973 in Peking, PRC. Between 1973 and 1981, Latheef played for his country at a number of international tournaments, including those in China, La Reunion, Indonesia and Sri Lanka, in many instances as the captain of his team. He was the captain of the team that won the Bronze medal at the First Indian Ocean Island Games in 1979, the first table tennis medal for the country. He also won three national singles titles and several doubles titles during his illustrious career as a national TT player. At present he is active as a Veteran player involved in promoting the sport at the national and regional level.



BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Asim Ahmed, Ph.D

Dr. Asim Ahmed began his career in public service over thirty years ago in 1985 at the former Ministry of Planning and National Development, Maldives. During that time, he rose rapidly through the ranks to become Director, Strategic Planning and contributed extensively in the area of planning and national development, both in the government and in collaboration with civil society organisations and international agencies.

Since September 2020, Dr. Asim Ahmed has been serving as the Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Maldives to the United Nations and Other International Organisations at Geneva, Switzerland. In October 2020 the President appointed him as the Permanent Representative of the Maldives to the World Trade Organisation. From March 2019 to September 2020, Dr. Asim served as Ambassador at Large at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Dr. Asim has addressed the UN General Assembly and the UN Security Council as well as the Human Rights Council, highlighting the Government's foreign policy goals of environmental diplomacy, the promotion of human rights and democratic governance.

From 2011to 2013, Dr. Asim served as the Minister of Education. During this time the President also appointed him periodically as the Acting Minister of Foreign Affairs and for a time as the Acting Minister of Tourism.
